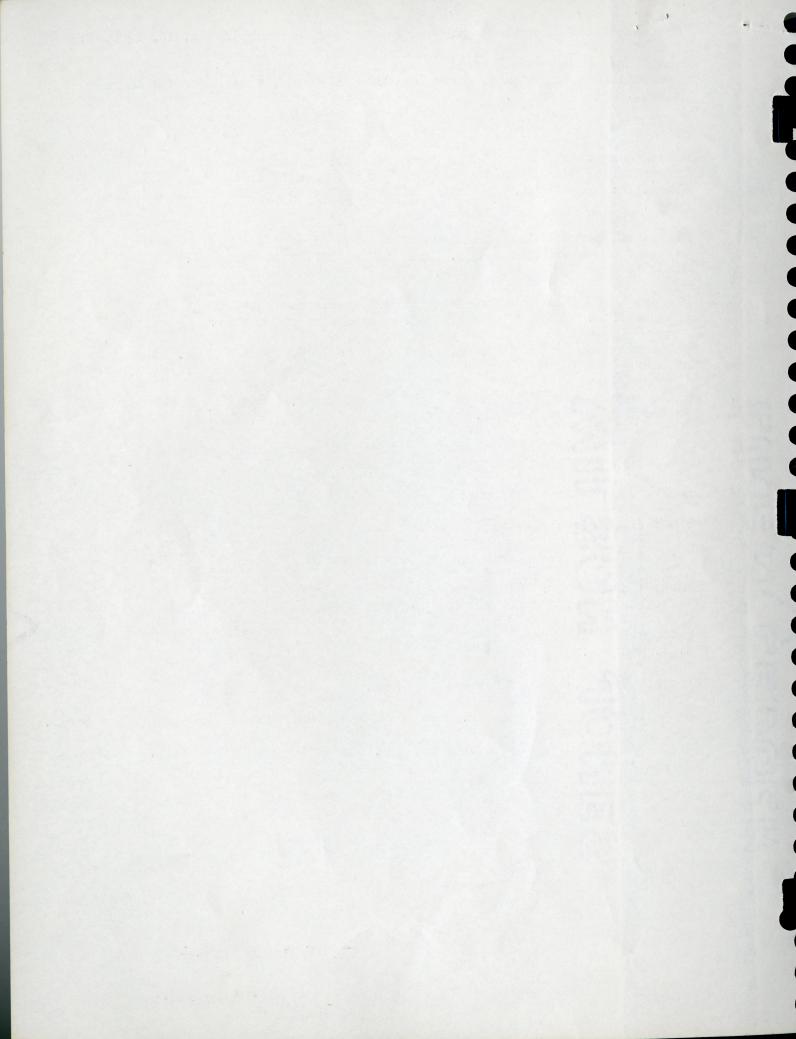

Macie Davey read Ordinance # 228 on Annexation to the City of Menan, in it's entirety.

Clyde Jones met with the City of Menan City Council to discuss possible trade of the Poole property to the City for the Ball property in the hope that the lagoon sight would be moved from it's exesting plan. No decision was reached as Mr Jones as asked for additional concessions. He stated that he felt it was unjust for the City to want 38 acres in exchange for the 26 acres on the Ball property.

Lyle Thompsonreported that to change the lagoon sight, there would be no additional Engineer fee. It would put the lagoons 700 feet closer to the Drybed but that it would take approximately 600 ft additional collector line. It would possible require an additional lift station at the cost of approximately \$25,000. There is still a question on material source. But the soil on the Ball property is better soil to build the lagoons.

Bob Wheeler congratulated the City on their work on the sewer project. Saying it was a long drawn out process but most obstacles were being removed. Mr Wheeler asked the City Council to consider Total Land Application for the discharge of the effulent. Beside being more expensive to monitor and treat the discharge into the drybed, Tom Ryneker of the Fish and Game Department was objecting to us discharging into the drybed, as there is too much discharge in the drybed from other sources. Mr Wheeler said that Total Land Application could possibly be designed to drain from Mal 1 tto Nov. 1.

There was some discussion on the issue of the State Legislaturepassing a State Grant program to assist in water and waste water funds, but the City of Menan was excluded from the priority list.

Ernest Barnes asked permission to put in another culvert. Permission granted.

Ronald Merrill is to contact Brent Poulter and obtain an Insurance release if he is going to use the hall for karoty lessons.

Dee Young from Lewisville contacted Larry Lee about having Mark Tanner patrol the City of Lewisville. There followed some discussion. No decision was reached.

Larry Lee made motion for an aption with Clyde Jones for a property exchange, The Ball property for the Ray Poole property, or the purchase of the Ray Poole property for a total of \$45,000. Motion seconded by Ronald Merrill. Motion carried. No protest.

He would like the privledge of renting the property for farming purposes.

Mayor Berrett reported that the Ray Poole property, aproximately 35 acres, can be bought for \$45,000.00, or less than #1,300.00 per acre, with \$10,000.00 down and unlimited time on the balance.

It has been decided to use the Drybed to drain of the effulent from the sewer in the winter and to use the water for land application in the summer.

Larry Lee reported that he had contacted Jim Dean, Tacoma, Washington, about Radar Speed Guns and had 2 recommendations. HR4 model is \$995.00 but not recommended as the frequency xxxxxxxxx maintance is too high. HR8 model is \$1,385.00 and can be purchased on a 36 month contract for \$47.70 per month, interest and carring charges \$332.40, total price \$1,717.40. If we purchase it we maybe able to rent it to outling towns. Lease cost runs 10 to 20% on all tickets written. Roberts is interested.

Frank Bird met with the City Council about a ditch rightway through his property. He was informed that the City has no controll over the ditch. That would be under the direction of the Ditch Co. or Canal Company.

Gail Lewis from Idaho Department of Park and Recreation, met with the Board and briefly discussed government grants that are available. They come under Land and water projects. They are 50% matching funds for land and outdoor equipment. The value of the land is based on an acceptable rate by the government.

When asked about the chuckholes in the streets, Ernest Barnes requested that we wait intill the frost was out of the ground before we start repairing the streets. The council agreed.

Mark Tanner and AJ Jenkins are to fix the drain on main street.

Mark has requested some road supplies from Mayor Berrett and A J Jenkins said he had all the supplies Mark needed.

Ronald Merrill reported that there were two trees on the City rightway between

Amos Williams and Fern Eddy's that were causing al lot of trouble with the power lines. Lynn Jacobs will knock down the trees and work up the wood if he can close off the road. The City Council gave Ronald Merrill permission to have this done.

Nona Toomer wanted to know what is to be done on cars being brought in by Poole's. She was informed that Mark Tanner was working with the Sherriff's Office and the City Attorney and Poole's would be given 7 days to clean these up.

Intermountain Gas representatives met with the City for approval of a franchise to bring natural gas into the City. The have 56 homes and 11 commercial assignments for natural gas. Verl D Richardson and Bud Birch from Intermountain Gas presented the City with an Ordanace to insure the Gas Company with a Guaranteed Franchise for 30 years to service the City with natural gas. The ordanance has to be read at three meetings, unless the City waived a hearing. It has to be published in the newspaper 30 days before signing and 30 days after. The Gas company will pay for the publishication. Tim Hawkins is the attorney for the Gas Co. A copy of convience has to be filed with the State. The Franchise frees the City of all liability. There has to be one primting before it is signed. Then signed by City Council.

Gary Jeppson, ECIPDA, informed the council that the City was eligible to file a joint application with Jefferson County for Small cities funding. Filing alone the City could only file for \$350,00 with Jefferson County \$450,000 basically for sewage collection. Compition is highly competive in this program. We have no guarantee. Preapplication must be filed by November 3, 1980. Two Public Hearings must be held before that time. Moderate to low income families are those having \$12,805.00 or less income for the year. The Citizens Committee should represent the low income families. and it would help to have a minority on the committee. Public hearings were set for Sept. 23 and Oct. 9, 1980.

Special Meeting held October 14, 1980 at Mayor Berrett's home. Menan, Idaho.

Present: Mayor Berrett, Lyle Thompson, Larry Lee, Macie Davey and Bob Wheeler

Mr Wheeler advised the City that we should be familiar with where we are and why delays occur and what we can do to prevent them.

Nation wide EPA pays about 90% of the funds they approve for a project funding and the City has to pay back the remaining 10% upon audit. All payments are subject to audit. EPA is a complex and difficult program. It is almost impossible to keep up with their regulations and changes. We need to take roots now. Make a schedule to keep track of the program and follow the schedule. The City of Menan is responsible for the program.

Mr Wheeler strongly advised the City to Send Larry Lee to the Cilren Co.s workshop so that Larry would know how to administer this Sewer Project.

Mr Wheeler said, the City needs to be aware of change orders. They would rather the City be over protected than not have proper protection. We are now starting on Step # 2 and are pretty well advanced. Step # 2 is on design and is very detailed. Step # 3 is on Construction. He advised an extensive check list to make sure we meet all standards.

Larry Lee asked about using local contractors and asked how it could be handled. He was advised that the only way we could use local contractors on EPA portion of the project was for the City to give the Prime Contractor a list of the local contractors with a recommendation he consider them for sub contract work. Only a few contractors have the necessary equipment. The City can only accept one bid. Some of the smaller jobs, home hookup may be contracted out.

We need to furnish Bob Wheeler with a cover sheet. There is to be a review for a pre design meeting for the City. When 10% completed, a 10% design rewiew, 50% design review and a final review.

Id delay occurs and we fall out of target date, notify Bob of delay and file a new schedule.

Hold a review with City, if City desires. Sometimes it is very helpful if the City is involved. One representative should be sufficient.

Send 3 copies of specifications to Bob Wheeler. He sends 2 sets to Army Corp. of Engineers for structural aspects. The Army Corp. of Engineers sends marked up specification to Bob Wheeler. Bob Wheeler sits down with Lyle Thompson and the City to cover complaints on specifications. Lyle answers to the Corp. comments and negotitates on some agreements. Whithin 45 days EPA should have all changes made. On Final design we need a minimum of four (4) sets of plans. One for Bob Wheeler, One for the engineer, one for the job and one for the City.

Timing is a very critical aspect in the plan of operation. The plan of operation has to be approved before we can advertise for bids.

Users charge system must be approved before time to advertise for bids, how we are going to assess it and the unit hookup. Lyle has standard user charge fees.

The Operation & Maintains Manuel has to be 50% complete when we advertise for bids and 80% complete on final. Slept 1981 Jenal in 7-lb-1982

Larry Lee made motion to pay Keith Walker \$45.00 per hour for his services for the remainder of the Sewer Project. Seconded by Ronnald Merrill. Motion passed. No protest.

SUBJECT: Potato Warehouses committment to hookup to Sewer.

Presiding: Larry Lee

Present: Larry Lee, Joe Gunderson, Nona Toomer, Wm. T Berrett, Lyle Thompson, Keith Walker, Curtis Christensen Gail Beard, Brent Call and Don Hancock.

Larry Lee called the meeting to order and stated the purpose of the meeting and then turned the time over to Lyle Thompson.

Mr Thompson read portions of a letter from EPA for our nedd to tighten up our committment with the potato warehouses in Menan to connect to the waste water treatment facilities in Menan. We need to set up a binding time schedule for completion of the industries pretreatment facilities and connection to the City's system, a provision for adaquate payment to the City for treatment services; limits on the industries' allowable waste contributions; monitoring requirements; etc,

In order for the City to obtain the nessary Grants and Loan necessary to construct these facilities they must pass an ordinance within the City making it mandatory for everyon within the City to hookup to the sewer. We need to outline the liable waistcontribution and the monitor system to be required. And establish a Users Charge Agreement.

Brent Call asked why it was necessary for the warehouses to hookup? The reason was to clean up the water table which is a local problem.

His next question was; if they were required to hookup why do they have to finance the pomds and the monitoring system? Answer: Settling ponds and monitoring systems are not elegible for government grants and the City has no means of financing them. He was informed that the patrons of the City of Meman was not in favor of allowing the Potato warehouses to participate because the cost was an additionan \$300,000.00

Warehouse owners say they have no ground to build settling ponds on and no one is interested in selling them any ground. They seem to feel as though the ponds they now have, and have been using for 30 years, are sufficient for their needs. There was some discussion of the hazards of the present ponds and the liabilities connected with them both to the warehouse operators as well as the City.

Mr Call said they needed guidelines to work on so they will know which way to go. Mr Thompson said they would be allowed a maximum of 25,00 gal. of effulent wach day.

It was agreed that the City did not want to impose a financial burden on the warehouse owners but they were very much in need of these facilities.

It was generally agreed that the settling ponds would have to be somewhere in the area of 40 ft X 80 ft. and be made out of cement so they could be cleaned. The water would have to be recycled.

Mr Thompson asked them is one years time was acceptable -- one year from the time of beginning of construction, aproximately 1 1/2 year from now. Mr Call said that he felt as though it was the City's responsibility as well as theirs. As he does not have the ground he could make No

committement. They had to have some alternatives.

Larry Lee asked them if they would seriously investigate what land is available and work with the City.

They were informed that the depth of the trunk lines and service lines have not been set as yet but survey work was being done now. The City has no idea what the expense would be to build the lagoons in the city but the State and EPA requires the warehouses hookup to the System.

Mr Call stated that in essence they were in our mercy. If the City passed an Ordinance making it mandatory for them to hoop up there was not much they could do. They were outside of the community but our problems were becoming their problems.

Larry Lee agreed, as an individual-not as a member of the Council, that he would see what he could do and Lyle said that he would make a call and see if there was any help available, and they would meet again in about a month.

Meeting adjourned.

It was generally understood that Gail Beard and Brent Call would work together on their settling ponds. It may be possible for them to work out some way to build settling ponds and the property owned by Gail Beard.

SUBJECT: POTATO WAREHOUSES

Presiding: Honorable Mayor Lee

Present: Mayor Larry E Lee, Joseph Gunderson, Roland L Walker, Lyle I Thompson Curtis Christensen, Ronald S Merrill, Terry Hammon, Gail Beard, Brent Call, Kay Clark and Macie Davey.

Prayer: Larry Lee

Mayor Lee informed the members of the meeting the status of the Sewer Project at the present time, stating that at the beginning of the project the City did not want to include the Potato Warehouses because of the additional expense involved. Where we were getting funds from the different agencies, namely EPA, State and our bond from FmHA it was necessary for the City to include the Potato Warehouses to take care of the purification and qualifications of our underground water. Our Bond is on a General Obligation Bond and the City will have to pass an ordinance requiring everyone within the City hookup to the Sewer Project. The Potato Warehouses must furnish their own settling ponds with the capacity of a 24 hour settling before dispersing into the sewer. The City of Menan will furnish the monitoring system and there are certain qualifications the Warehouses will have to meet. This will be worked out through a contract between the City and the Warehouses at the time the Ordinance is written.

Lyle Thompson informed them that there was an additional cost to the City, State, and EPA of \$200,000.00 for expended additional room for effulent of the Warehouses. The City will take care of the underground area of the facility. The Warehouse owners concern was the pretreatment facility. The Facility will take care of 25,000 gal waste water after a 24 hour detention time. The pretreatment facility would have to be built out of concrete with provisions made for clean out whenever necessary. The City will rum the lines to the property line any other expense will be for the owner. A rough extimate of the cost of building the pretreatment facilities was \$20,000.00 each. The Warehouse Owners were informed that the pretreatment facility plan must pass State Health before construction.

Mr. Walker was disturbed because he has had no say in the matter. He was informed that there had been six public hearings all of which he should have attended.

In the discussion on the fee to be charged, Mr Thompson stated there would be a fee based on residential and one on commercial. He stated that there had been nothing worked out for sure but he thought the commercial fee would be somewhere between \$100.00 to \$130.00 per month as a rough estimate.

The Government will not help in any way to finance the Pretreatment Facility and the City has no means of assisting the Warehouses. They are obligated as much as they can with the General Obligation Bond to build the Menan Sewer Project.

The City of Menan will have to get with the Warehouse owners and draw up a Contract, have letters of Intent and establish a Users Fee.

Brent Call argued that the Whole System should be the City's responsibility. The City should not Assess the Warehouses the 6% additional cost they had to incure of the \$200,000.00 to build lagoons large enough to support them. If the City requires them to hookup then the City should furnish the lagoons.

After some discussion, Ronald Merrill made a motion that the City of Menan would furnish the lagoons with no additional costs to the warehouses.

Kay Clark seconded the motion. Motion carried. No Protest.

There was a lot of discussion on different alternatives available to use for cleanup of the sludge in the pretreatment troughs.

The Warehouse Owners were informed that they would have I year after the bids on the Sewer Project were let to complete their project. That would be approximately I year from the first of June.

After some discussion it was decided that as soon as Lyle had things worked out the City would get back to the Warehouse Owners to negotiate the contract and the final agreement.

Mayor Lee informed the City Council that we now have the final easement on the Molen Ditch and the easement from Harold Ball to cross his property. All the land has been purchased.

PUBLIC NOTICE -- PUBLIC HEARING, held Menan, Idaho March 19, 1981. Menan City Hall.

Gary Jeppson of ECIPDA conducted the meeting. Mr Jeppson explained the purpose of the Comunity Block Grants Program to assist Low to Moderate Income individuals within the City. He asked for imput into the project planning.

The City of Menan in conjuction with the Jefferson County has filed a preapplication withHUD for \$450,000.00 grant. Low to moderate income families are those households with a combined annual income of less than \$12,803.00 per year. Approximately \$300,000.00 will go for a portion of the collection hookup and approximately \$150,00.00 will pay for low to moderate income hookup. \$450,000.00 is the maximum of the Grant, which the City should receive. There is very little chance of this Grant being decreased but there is always the possibility of running out of funds. When asked who would decide as to whom were eligible for low to moderate income hookups, Mr Jeppson said the burden of proof falls upon the City of Menan to prove who is eligible.

Home owners who do not qualify have the priveledge of deciding who they have do the hookup work. They can do it theirselves as long as they follow the guidlines set by the City Council.

If home owners have a contractor do the hookyp, the Contractor is responsible for a certain period of time. Individual hookyp if installed by individual, then the individual is responsible.

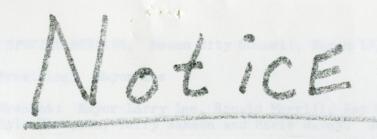

The pipe comes in $12\frac{1}{2}$ ft and 20 ft lengths. Thus having less joints.

Mr Webb stated that 10 and 12 inch pipe was comparable to concrete in cost but that 8 inch pipe was slightly more expensive. Possibly 25 to 30 cents a foot but that installation was less because of the length of the pipe.

He stated that the market was depressed at this time and the price of pipe was down.

Mr Webb left information on PVC pipe for the City to study.

Joel Cook, District appointee for the Rigby, Ririe and Menan, fire district, met with the City Council and offered a proposal for incorporating the Menan Fire District with Ririe and Rigby, thus establishing One District in place of the three we now have. He stated that after October 1, 1981 there would be no County support for the fire districts. His proposal would place two fire trucks in Menan, one to be on call anywhere in the district. Two trucks in Rigby and two in Ririe. He said a mill levy would have to be passed to support the program but that insurances would go down. The City advised Mr Cook to contact Elmer Thomas and Charles Miller as they were in charge of the Menan Fire District. It does not come under the jurisdiction of the City.

Linda French, Ellen Lindstrom and Steve Thornton met with the City Council hoping to get a committment from the City for support of the Quick Response Unit. Their government funds have been cut off and they are in need of new truck. Their territory entends from Kelley's Canyon to the River bridge in Roberts and they only have one vehicle. They are also in need of medical supplies. They have five medical tecnicans from Menan but need the additional equipment to better serve the community. They received \$1,000.00 plus 1,000.00 per year from Rigby and Lewisville gave them \$500.00 plus \$500.00 per year. The City they would discuss the possibilities but that Menan was obligated to the Sewer Project at this time but would support fund raisers.

Gary Jeppson stated that the City would have to involve minorities in the HUD portion of the Sewer Project.

Mr Jeppson said that he had neglected to include a map of the Sewer lines to be funded by HUD and had listed Larry Lee's number for Engineers to contact on the Engineer's proposal. As Larry Lee was out of town and a certain engineer was unable to contact him, he had received a request for one weeks time extention on Engineers Proposal for HUD portion of the Menan Sewer Project.

Kay Clark made motion to extend the time period on the Engineers proposal of the HUD grant to June 19, 1981/ Ronald Merrill seconded the motion. Motion passed. No protest.

The minutes of the previous meeting were read and approved with no changes. Nona Toomer made motion to accept minutes as read seconded by Joe Gunderson. Motion passed with no protest.

Joe Gunderson reported to the City Council that he had contacted George Clements and there is a possibility that the fire rating in the City of Menan can be changed from a 9 to a 8 rating, thus decreasing the fire insurance within the City. We need to check with the Idaho Survey and Rating Bureau. Mrs Davey will check this out.

Mr and Mrs Blaine Barney met with the City Council to see why they were not annexed into the City. The Council explained to the Barneys that due to the location of their house and the present plans for the location of the sewer lines it would necessitate the installation of another manhole Left that to connect them to the sewer project. Due to the additional expense involved the City of Menan was unable to finance this additional cost (approximately \$45,000.00) and neither EPA, State or HUD would help finance it because it was not cost effective. If there had been additional homes built out there it is possible that financing could be arranged. Mrs Barney stated that they wanted to be annexed into the City so that they would be able to sell their property as building sites. The City Council advised thaem that it would be possible to do this if financing could be arranged to the satisfaction of the City to put in the additional lines and an additional lift station, which the City would maintain after installation. The City also advised Mr Barney that they may be able to hockup to the present plans by putting an individuallift pump in their home to raise effulent to the necessary level. The Barneys also asked about putting in septic tanks, if they should sell their property to home builders. Mr Thompson told them that he was sure they could devide their property into one acre lots and put in individual septic tanks.

After some discussion by the City Council, Ronald Merrill made a motion for the City of Menan to handle the building permits for the future building within the City of Menan. Rates set at \$10.00 for residential and \$25.00 for commercial, Seconded by Joseph Gunderson. Motion carried. No protest. a change order and cost the City additional expense.

- 2. Mayor Lee reported that Clyde Jones told him that Ray Poole had promised him first chance to buy his property. When he decided to sell, Lynn Hart advised him and also President Berrett. It is a well known fact to the City Council, that Mayor Berrett met with Ray Poole and had a verbal agreement to purchase his property for \$43,000.00, subject to the approval of the City Council. Preseident Berrett was to give him a final answer on Monday. Then on Sunday, Clyde Jones contacted Ray Poole and signed an agreement to purchase his property for the same money.  3. It was pointed out that, at the time the City of Menan was negioating
- with Long Island Canal Company to discharge waistwater into the Canal, Clye Jones wasone of the stockholders who voted against it, thus necessitating the City purchase more property for sprinkling purpose to take care of their wastewater.
- 4. All the funding from the different agencies have been o'K ed. now we need an agreement to release funding. HUD's funds are available. We only need a release from the State as EPA has released these funds to the State. EPA and MBE has to be worked out by Monday in order to meet out deadline.

Construction contracts has to be let by November 8th, 1981.

Gene Burch reported that our Bonding funds from FHma were ready to be released as soon as EPA and State funds were release. This is there only restrictions. He, also, stated that if there is a delay in the project it may necessitate another Bond Election, as this Bond Election was held in 1978 and the funds committed were on a 5% interest. If these funds are now jised now, the interest would raise to 12% with a 2% surcharge.

Keith Walker stated that the Bond Council was slated to meet the first part of November.
